AMDAHL

During the 1960s, Gene Amdahl was Director of IBM's Advanced Computing Systems Laboratory in Menlo Park, California, where he led the design of the IBM/360 computer and other models, working with Project Manager Fred Brooks, Jr. In 1970, he left IBM to found the Amdahl Corporation, where he remained until 1980. He has also served as Chairman of Trilogy Systems, which develops high-performance computer systems. Amdahl has won many awards, including the ACM/ IEEE Eckert-Mauchly Award. He is a Fellow of the National Academy of Engineering and the IEEE, and a distinguished Fellow of the British Computer Society. He received a B.S.E.P. degree from South Dakota State University, and M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in theoretical physics from the University of Wisconsin.
